


## **Confined Space Entry Monitor**

## Chapter 2.2 Confined Space Identification

Confined spaces can be difficult to identify. Legislation gives a broad overview of what constitutes a confined space, but how can workers be certain if they are about to enter one? The following flowchart outlines a common process used to identify whether a space is considered a confined space or not

## Confined Space Identification Chart

Is the space enclosed or partially enclosed?	NO	YES		
Is the space large enough and so configured that an employee can enter and perform assigned work?	YES	NO		
Does the space have limited or restricted means of entry or exit?	NO	YES		
Is the space designed for continuous human occupancy?	YES	NO		
If answers only appear in GREEN, then the space is NOT A CONFINED SPACE.  If answers appear in BOTH GREEN AND RED, or ONLY RED, then the space is a CONFINED SPACE.
